APRIL FUN & ACTIVITIES



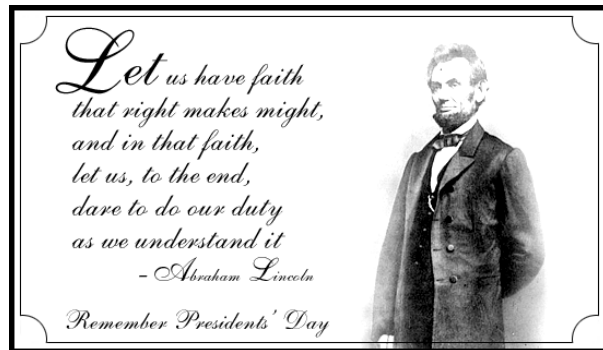

⇒ Committing Sins and not feeling any guilt. Sins leave disturbing and damaging effects, on the body and soul, which have consequences both in this world and the Hereafter. Some of these effects are:

- ◇ **Deprivation of knowledge.**
- ◇ **Withdrawal of blessings**
- ◇ **Loneliness:**
- ◇ **Facing hardship.**
- ◇ **Feeling anxiety.**
- ◇ **Prevention from doing other obedient acts.**
- ◇ **The shortening of one's lifespan:** When a person turns away from Allah, and dedicates him/herself to committing sins, he/she would waste his/her real life here, about which he/she would say one day: **[Oh! If I had prepared for this life of mine]** [surat al-Fajr, verse 24]

- ⇒ Having a hard heart and no desire to read Quran.
- ⇒ Feeling too last to good deeds.
- ⇒ Neglecting Sunnah.
- ⇒ Having mood swings. Getting bothered with petty things.
- ⇒ Not feeling anything when hearing the verses of Quran.
- ⇒ Finding difficulty in remembering Allah.
- ⇒ Not feeling bad when things are done against Allah's command.
- ⇒ Being mean and miserly.
- ⇒ Ordering others to do good deeds when not doing it themselves.
- ⇒ Feeling good when things are not progressing for others.
- ⇒ Being concerned about halal and haram only and not avoiding makrooh (not recommended/ disliked)
- ⇒ Making fun of people who do simple good deeds.
- ⇒ Not feeling concerned about when others are hurt.
- ⇒ Not feeling the responsibility to serve and promote true faith.
- ⇒ Liking to argue for the sake of argument without having knowledge
- ⇒ Becoming engrossed and very involved in worldly things and forget about life after death.
- ⇒ Becoming engrossed and obsessive about ourselves.

HOW TO INCREASE OUR FAITH?

- * Recite and ponder meaning of The Qur'an.
- * Realize the Greatness of Allah.
- * Make an effort to gain knowledge that benefit.
- * Attend gatherings where Allah is remembered.
- * Increase doing good deeds.
- * Must fear the miserable end of our lives.
- * Remember the different levels of Akhirah.
- * Make dua (supplication).
- * Love for Allah must be shown in actions. Faith is complete with good deeds.
- * Realize the effects of sins and disobedience.



Abdullah bin 'Abbas (radi Allaahu anhu) said: "A good deed brings illumination to the face, light in the heart, power in the body, and love in the people's hearts. A bad deed shows as dullness in the face, darkness in the heart, weakness in the body, shortage of blessings, and hatred in people's hearts."

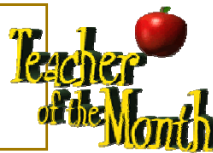


SCHOOL UNIFORM MUST BE IN SCHOOL APPROVED COLORS ONLY
